Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2)

(continued) The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes (“Tribes”) will reduce diesel emissions on Tribal lands by replacing the described vehicle with a 2020 Class 8 Helie Firefighter Rescue fire engine with life-saving accessories. Here is our cost breakdown:

Services provided by this new fire fighting truck are vital to the health and welfare of the Tribes and neighboring communities because the vehicle replaces emergency equipment that used in suppressing fires that affect land and people’s homes, animals and even their individual safety.

The original fire fighting truck being replaced will be scrapped. “Scrapped” shall mean to render inoperable and available for recycle, and, at a minimum, to specifically cut a 3-inch hole in the engine block for all engines. If any Eligible Vehicle will be replaced as part of an Eligible project, Scrapped shall also include the disabling of the chassis by cutting the vehicle’s frame rails completely in half.

Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3)

NOx and reduction of other pollutants were estimated by utilizing the Environmental Protection Agency’s Diesel Emissions Quantifier at <https://cfpub.epa.gov/quantifier>. The estimated annual NOx reduction (in short tons) is 94.8%; the NOx reduction over the replacement vehicle’s lifetime is also 94.8%. Details follow:

Shoshone-Bannock Tribes will establish a webpage dedicated to the funding received from the VW Settlement Trust, which will include a link for members of the public to request additional information and documents related to the funding request and expenditure of funds. The Tribes will endeavor to respond to such requests within ten (10) business days and, when documents are requested, will advise the individual within that timeframe of the procedure for reviewing such documents.

Shoshone-Bannock Tribes follow Tribal and Federal law and all applicable laws governing the access and distribution of information and publication of confidential business and personally identifiable information. The information disclosure is subject to the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes' Privacy Act, however, the Fort Hall Business Council, the governing body for the Tribes, has passed a resolution that authorized the public disclosure of said information to the extent not in violation of federal law, such as the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, United States Privacy Act or HIPAA. Personally identifiable information will be redacted or not shared.

The first semi-annual report will be submitted by May 12, 2021, no later than six months after Shoshone-Bannock Tribes receives its first disbursement of Trust Assets. Thereafter, semi-annual reporting will be done no later than January 30 (for the preceding six-month period of July 1 to December 31) and July 30 (for the preceding six-month period of January 1 to June 30) of each year, we shall submit to the Trustee a semiannual report describing the progress implementing our project during the six-month period leading up to the reporting date (including a summary of all costs expended on the Eligible Mitigation Action through the reporting date). Such reports shall include a complete description of the status including actual or projected termination date, development, implementation and any modifications of each approved Eligible Mitigation Action. The Tribes' Finance Department and Air Quality Program will review and audit expenditures of Eligible Mitigation Actions, to ensure compliance with applicable law. These reports will be signed by an official with authority to submit the report and will contain an attestation that the information is true and correct and that the submission is made under penalty of perjury.

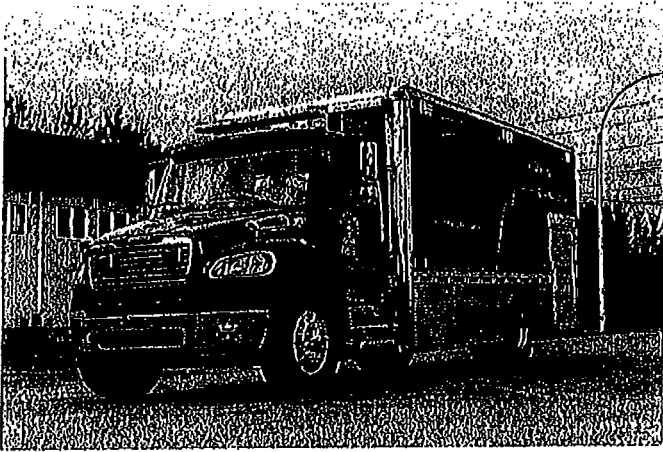
