Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits(5.2.2):

In the final funding cycle of the Volkswagen Settlement Environmental Mitigation Trust for Indian Tribes, the Campo Band of Diegueno Mission Indians will its government-owned diesel vehicle:

The vehicle will be replaced with a new, low-emission diesel truck. The Campo Band intends that the term "scrapped" means to render inoperable and available for recycle, and, at a minimum, to specifically cut a 3" or larger hole in the engine block of the vehicle and disabling each chassis by cutting the vehicle's frame rails complete in half and that the vehicle is to be replaced with assistance of this VW Settlement project.

The Campo Band will acquire the 2022 Ford F-650 – Enoven Dump Truck following vehicle:

The total cost of the replacement vehicle is APPROXIMATELY \$132,213. The cost of the new vehicle has been obtained from a website (See **Rush Truck Centers -Attachment 2**). Sales Tax and Registration is also estimated by utilizing California Motor Vehicle website (See Vehicle Registration Fee Calculator Attachment). The total reflected includes the exemption for Tribes for the VLF portion of the registration fee (See **Attachment - 11.080 Indian-Owned Vehicles**). Delivery costs of the vehicle to Campo Indian Reservation are estimated at \$2,350 to cover the costs of 2 persons for roundtrip to location 500 miles away. Disabling, disposal and hauling is estimated in this itemized expense table as well. Additional costs include administrative costs for the purchase and administrative requirements related to the purchase of the new vehicle – this time is estimated below.

Administrative Costs include the time for the Campo Environmental Protection Agency to administer the purchase of the vehicle and installation of accessories and oversight of disabling and disposal of vehicle. These costs are detailed in the table below.

Thereafter, semi-annual reporting will be done no later than January 30 (for the preceding six-month period of July 1 to December 31). The Campo Band shall submit to the Trustee a semiannual report describing the progress implementing the project during the six-month period leading up to the reporting date (including a summary of all costs expended on the Eligible Mitigation Action through the reporting date).

Chapter 11: Transfers

11.080 Indian-Owned Vehicles

Chapter 11 Transfers

11.080 Indian-Owned Vehicles

California Indian Tribes and/or Tribal Members (U.S. Code, Title 28, §1360(b)) Vehicles owned or leased by the California Indian tribe and/or tribal member living on a federal Indian reservation or rancharia located in California and operated on public roads on or off the reservation or rancharia are exempt from the VLF portion **only** of California registration fees. The exemption **must be** established annually upon renewal.

In addition to the procedures listed in the Basic Transfer Requirements section in this chapter, the following must be submitted:

An Indian Certification on the [Miscellaneous Certifications \(REG 256A\) \(PDF\)](#) form completed and signed by a representative of the tribe or an official of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, U.S. Government. A new REG 256A form **is required** annually upon renewal.

Federally-Recognized Indian Tribes (CVC §9104.5 and CR&TC §10781.1) Vehicles registered to a federally-recognized Indian tribal name and used exclusively within the boundaries and jurisdiction of the tribe are exempt from all fees, other than the registration fee (without the miscellaneous city/county fees). The fee exemption **must be** established annually upon renewal.

In addition to the procedures listed in the Basic Transfer Requirements section in this chapter, the following must be submitted:

- A letter written on Indian tribal letterhead and signed by an authorized tribal counsel member, such as the tribal chief or secretary, which identifies the vehicle and states it is owned by and being registered in the federally-recognized Indian tribal name and will be used exclusively within the boundaries of Indian tribal land, including any incidental operation on highways within those boundaries.
- The registration fee, if registration renewal is required at the time of transfer. The application is exempt from all other fees.

Transfer from Indian-Owned to Someone Else—In addition to the procedures listed in the Basic Transfer Requirements section in this chapter, the following must be submitted:

VLF from the month of transfer or date of first operation by the buyer, the transfer fee, and any other fees due.
