Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality

Benefits (5.2.2): Utilizing Volkswagen Settlement Trust funds, the Quapaw Tribe of Indians will be replacing one diesel vehicle with a newer model year diesel vehicle to improve air quality in the community. A 2011 Emissions Inventory completed by the Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office described approximately 2,000 tons per year (2% of total NOx emissions from Emissions Inventory Coverage Area) of NOx emissions being released by on-road mobile sources within Ottawa County, Oklahoma (in which most of the Quapaw Tribe reservation resides). Utilizing the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Diesel Emission Quantifier (DEQ), approximately 1 tons of NOx will be reduced from the replacement of the diesel vehicle that the Tribe owns. The eligible mitigation project submitted in this Project Management Plan was selected based on the prioritized need to replace an outdated diesel vehicle in the current inventory owned and operated by The Quapaw Tribe of Indians. A dire need to replace harmful NOx emissions from used and high-mileage emergency response vehicles will take priority, followed (upon availability of funds in subsequent funding cycles) by vehicle replacements of the Tribe's construction, agricultural and maintenance department vehicles which are utilized daily to haul waste and provide various services within the Tribe's jurisdiction, as well as in the surrounding areas.

Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3): An approximate 89.8% of NOx reductions are anticipated over the lifetime of the diesel vehicle replacement with the new diesel vehicle. This includes approximately 11,904 gallons of diesel fuel being reduced over the vehicle's lifetime. This information was collected following utilization of the EPA DEQ.

While this specific eligible mitigation project will have an infinitesimally small impact to mitigation NOx emission in the community, the need of the Quapaw Tribe of Indians to upgrade its existing fleet of vehicles is of the utmost importance in responding to the community needs. Ottawa County has a rather busy interstate, Interstate 44, that transects through its boundaries and, due to prevailing winds, a large amount of on-road mobile road emissions migrates north and east through the Quapaw Tribe of Indians jurisdiction. The Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office has been conducting air monitoring of criteria air pollutants listed in the National Ambient Air Quality Standards for almost two decades and has been submitting this data to EPA's Air Quality Systems Database to be validated and verified since 2001.

I. INTRODUCTION

A. Request for Funding

The Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office (QTEO) [Lead Agency], on behalf of The Quapaw Tribe of Indians [Beneficiary], is requesting funding from the Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for Indian Tribe Beneficiaries to fund environmental mitigation projects, as identified in this Project Management Plan, in reducing emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx) and Eligible Mitigation Action Administrative Expenditures. This request is made pursuant to the provisions set forth in the Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for Indian Tribe Beneficiaries (Trust Agreement) and Appendices D-2, D-3 and D-4 of the Trust Agreement.

The QTEO's funding request for \$137,888 will allow The Quapaw Tribe of Indians to reduce approximately 90% (EPA Diesel Emission Quantifier) of NOx emissions after vehicle replacements. This Project Management Plan has been incorporated into Attachment B of Appendix D-4 Beneficiary Eligible Mitigation Action Certification (in accordance with provision 5.2.4 of the Trust Agreement).

B. Lead Agency Roles and Responsibilities

As the Quapaw Tribe of Indians identified Lead Agency in Appendix D-3 of the Trust Agreement, the Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office's roles and responsibilities include management and implementation of the environmental mitigation actions identified in this Project Management Plan. The Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office is currently administering various Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) grants and cooperative agreements under provisions of the Clean Water Act (106, 319), Clean Air Act (103) and Superfund (Remedial Response and Management Assistance). Through managing and implementing program and project activities of these various grants and cooperative agreements, the Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office has the capacity to manage and implement the mitigation actions identified in this Project Management Plan.

Mr. Tim Kent, Environmental Director has over 15 years of experience in working with EPA grants and cooperative agreements. Mr. Craig Kreman, Assistant Environmental Director has 4 years of experience in working with EPA grants and cooperative agreements. Additionally, Mr. Kreman serves on the National Tribal Air Association (NTAA), representing EPA Region 6 Tribes as the primary representative. Mr. Kreman is currently the NTAA Volkswagen Settlement Work Group Co-Lead.

II. PROJECT NARRATIVE

A. Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2)

The Quapaw Tribe has grown from roughly 3,300 enrolled members (Tribal Administration Census, 2010) to approximately 5,054 enrolled members (Tribal Administration Census, 2017) as of December 1, 2017, representing a greater need to improve air quality within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Tribe. The Quapaw Tribe jurisdiction is also included in the Joplin-Miami, MO-OK Combined Statistical Area (as reported by the US Census Bureau) that includes a population over 200,000. A 2011 Emissions Inventory completed by the Quapaw Tribe Environmental Office described approximately

2,000 tons per year (2% of total NOx emissions from Emissions Inventory Coverage Area) of NOx emissions being released by on-road mobile sources within Ottawa County, Oklahoma (in which most of the Quapaw Tribe reservation resides). Utilizing the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Diesel Emission Quantifier (DEQ), approximately 1 tons of NOx will be reduced from the replacement of the diesel vehicle that the Tribe owns. The eligible mitigation project submitted in this Project Management Plan was selected based on the prioritized need to replace an outdated diesel vehicle in the current inventory owned and operated by The Quapaw Tribe of Indians. A dire need to replace harmful NOx emissions from used and high-mileage emergency response vehicles will take priority, followed (upon availability of funds in subsequent funding cycles) by vehicle replacements of the Tribe's construction, agricultural and maintenance department vehicles which are utilized daily to haul waste and provide various services within the Tribe's jurisdiction, as well as in the surrounding areas. Currently, the Quapaw Tribe Fire/Emergency Management Service ambulances frequently transport citizens to and from local hospitals, fire trucks frequently respond to emergency response calls due to their certifications; and the Quapaw Tribe of Indians are the lead agency in cleaning up contaminated waste at the Tar Creek Superfund Site (construction dump trucks are used daily in hauling this contaminated material to a consolidation area for final disposition).

To successfully complete the proposed eligible mitigation actions and improve air quality while reducing NOx emissions, the QTEO anticipates completing the following two major tasks: Equipment and Administrative Expenditures.
