Electrify RI is an electric vehicle (EV) charging station incentive program, administered by the Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources (OER), that seeks to make more charging stations accessible to Rhode Island drivers. The increased availability of charging stations will encourage state residents and business to make the switch to electric vehicles in order to reduce transportation-related carbon emissions and pollutarits. This \$1.4 million incentive program will help fund the installation of new EV charging stations — including Level II and Direct Current Fast Charging (OCFC) — at Rhode Island workplaces, multi-unit dwellings, state and local government properties, and publicly-accessible locations. Incentives will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis.
As of December 31, 2019, OER received 65 Level II EVSE applications, and 11 DCFC EVSE applications, and has approved 14 Level II and 3 DCFC EVSE Projects.
