Maine Rule of Civil Procedure 26(c) provides that a trade secret or other confidential research, development, or commercial information may be the subject of a protective order by a court, when sought during discovery. Also, Rule 507 of the Maine Rules of Evidence contains a privilege to refuse to disclose, and prevent others from disclosing, a trade secret. The Maine Supreme Judicial Court has looked to the definition of "trade secret" in Maine's Uniform Trade Secrets Act, 10 M.R.S. § 1542(4), in interpreting "trade secret" claims for non-disclosure under FOAA. That definition includes information that "[d]erives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use" and "[i]s the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy."

Maine's FOAA contains exceptions to disclosure for certain personally identifiable information such as social security numbers. 1 M.R.S. § 402(3)(N).
