Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure (Phase 1)	9	This project requested \$13,500,000.00 for the installation of 78 direct current (DC) fast chargers at 27 sites along Interstates 95, 75, and 4. To date, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has executed 24 of 27 grant agreements and encumbered \$7,524,195.11 of the \$24,941,811.60 received from the Trustee. Of the 24 in progress projects, six site have been completed and are available for use.					
Electric School Bus	2	The Department has received the first \$57,000,000 of the total \$116,395,121.18 intended for use in electric school bus projects. The Department recently built and delivered 5 of the 7 grant packages to school districts for electric school buses. The final two grants are in development and will be issued soon.
