#### **SUMMARY**

**Eligible Mitigation Action Type** Appendix D-2, Mitigation Action 8. Forklifts and Port Cargo Handling Equipment.

**Explanation of how funding request fits into Beneficiary's Mitigation Plan (5.2.1):** VW funding will provide incentives to replace older diesel-powered cargo handling equipment with new, electric cargo handling equipment as stated in New York's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan (BMP). Up to \$1 million in New York's allocation from the VW Mitigation Trust has been proposed for EMA 8: Forklifts and Port Cargo Handling Equipment. **Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2):** Cargo handling equipment replacement incentive funding will be made available through the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) 'New York Truck Voucher Incentive Program (NYTVIP)' to replace older cargo handling equipment that often operate near Disadvantaged Communities. The new cargo handling equipment will be all-electric and result in significant decreases in NOx emissions and improved local air quality. Existing, older diesel-powered cargo handling equipment will be scrapped.

Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3): The projected 10-year vehicle lifetime NOx emission benefits from replacing an estimated 4 older diesel-powered cargo handling equipment with all-electric cargo handling equipment is estimated to be 54 tons. In addition, greenhouse gases will be reduced from these projects. The EPA DEQ was used to estimate anticipated NOx reductions from this project. Final NOx emission reductions will be calculated based on the actual port cargo handling equipment projects completed under this mitigation action.

New York State submitted an Appendix D-3, Certification for Beneficiary Status Under Environmental Trust Agreement, on November 1, 2017, in which the State of New York (NYS) agreed to maintain and make publicly available all documentation and records:

- (i) submitted by it in support of each funding request; and
- (ii) supporting all expenditures of the Trust Fund by the State of New York, each until the Termination Date of the Trust pursuant to Paragraph 6.8 of the Trust Agreement. **Describe any cost share requirement to be placed on each NOx source proposed to be mitigated (5.2.8).** VW funding, provided through the NYSERDA 'NYTVIP', will fund a portion of the cost of an eligible, new or repowered cargo handling equipment. The level of VW funding will depend on the vehicle type (e.g., new or repowered).

An incentive schedule (e.g., table) has been established and is displayed on NYSERDA 'NYTVIP' vehicle replacement program public website. The vehicle-specific (by make/model) incentive amount will be based on, the lesser of either:

- i) a percentage of the new or repowered vehicle incremental cost, or
- ii) new or repowered vehicle funding cap.

New vehicle incremental cost is defined as the cost difference between a new electric cargo handling equipment and the equivalent eligible new diesel cargo handling equipment. Repowered vehicle incremental cost is defined as the cost difference between a repowered electric cargo handling equipment and the equivalent eligible new diesel cargo handling equipment. The outstanding balance of the new replacement vehicle after the NYSERDA 'NYTVIP' incentive will be provided by the vehicle owner or lessee.

## Describe how the Beneficiary complied with subparagraph 4.2.8, related to notice to U.S. Government Agencies (5.2.9).

NYSDEC (lead agency) notified the U.S. Government agencies as prescribed in 5.2.9 via email on February 9, 2018. See attached Notice of Availability of Mitigation Action Funds.

## If applicable, describe how the mitigation action will mitigate the impacts of NOx emissions on communities that have historically borne a disproportionate share of the adverse impacts of such emissions (5.2.10).

New York State's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan, Clean Transportation NY, describes the overall goals of improving air quality and accelerating the transition to zero emission transportation through funding made available under the Volkswagen Trust. These air quality improvement goals include reducing nitrogen oxides (NOx), greenhouse gases, particulate matter, hydrocarbon, and mobile source air toxics emissions throughout the state. Funding those projects described in the Plan will result in significant NOx reductions while accelerating the transformation to a zero-tailpipe emission transportation system. Projects will be located throughout New York State, with a particular focus on communities and neighborhoods subject to a disproportionate amount of air pollution from diesel-powered vehicles and equipment. The NYSERDA 'NYTVIP' will conduct targeted outreach to entities that operate cargo handling equipment near Disadvantaged Communities and will report on the award of incentives for cargo handling equipment operated near these areas.

This cargo handling equipment replacement project will lower NOx emissions and improve local air quality by replacing older diesel powered, higher emitting cargo handling equipment that operates near residential areas. These replacement pieces of cargo handling equipment are all-electric and will improve local air quality in communities that that have historically borne a disproportioned share of the adverse impact of diesel exhaust emissions.

Detailed Plan for Reporting on Eligible Mitigation Action Implementation (5.2.11)

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation will meet the requirements of Appendix D to the Partial Consent Decree, section 5.3:

**5.3 Beneficiary Reporting Obligations:** For each Eligible Mitigation Action, no later than six months after receiving its first disbursement of Trust Assets, and thereafter no later than January 1 and July 1 of each year, each Beneficiary shall serve upon the Trustee, a semiannual report describing the progress implementing each Eligible Mitigation Action during the six-month period leading up to the reporting date (including a summary of all costs expended on the Eligible Mitigation Action through the reporting date). Such reports shall include a complete description of the status (including actual or projected termination date), development, implementation, and any modification of each approved Eligible Mitigation Action.

Beneficiaries may group multiple Eligible Mitigation Actions and multiple sub-beneficiaries into a single report. These reports shall be signed by an official with the authority to submit the report for the Beneficiary and must contain an attestation that the information is true and correct and that the submission is made under penalty of perjury. To the extent a Beneficiary avails itself of the DERA Option described in Appendix D-2, that Beneficiary may submit its DERA Quarterly Programmatic Reports in satisfaction of its obligations under this subparagraph as to those Eligible Mitigation Actions funded through the DERA Option. The Trustee shall post each semiannual report on the Trust's public-facing website upon receipt.

#### Dear Sir/Madam:

On November 1, 2017, New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo signed the Notice of Filing of Certification for Beneficiary Status Under the Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for the State of New York. Further, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation was designated as the Lead Agency for purposes of the Beneficiary's participation in the Environmental Mitigation Trust and was delegated the authority to act on, behalf of, and legally bind the Beneficiary for purposes of the Trust.

On January 29, 2018, Wilmington Trust, N.A., as Trustee of the Volkswagen Diesel Emissions Environmental Mitigation Trust for State Beneficiaries, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia (the State Trust"), included the State of New York as a Designated Beneficiary under the State Trust.

In accordance with paragraph 4.2.8 of the Trust Agreement, "[each] Certifying Entity will provide a copy of the State Trust Agreement with Attachments to the U.S. Department of the Interior, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and any other Federal Agency that has custody, control, or management of land within or contiguous to the territorial boundaries of the Certifying Entity and has by then notified the Certifying Entity of its interest hereunder, explaining that the Certifying Entity may request Eligible Mitigation Action funds for use on lands within that Federal Agency's custody, control, or management (including, but not limited to, Clean Air Act Class I and II areas), and setting forth the procedures by which the Certifying Entity will review, consider, and make a written determination upon each such request.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has not received notice from any federal agency regarding projects to be funded by the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust. As such, this letter is being sent to the designated United States Departments of the Interior and Agriculture contacts to fulfill
