SUMMARY

Eligible Mitigation Action Type Appendix D-2, Mitigation Action 9. Municipal DCFC Light Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE). This funding request directs VW Trust funding to NYPA to support municipal DCFC light duty EVSE.

Explanation of how funding request fits into Beneficiary's Mitigation Plan (5.2.1): VW funding directed to NYPA to support DCFC light duty EVSE projects with the Jamestown Board of Public Utilities. NY will install 4 DCFC chargers in Jamestown to support the usage and adoption of electric vehicles as stated in New York's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan (BMP). Up to \$19.2 million of New York's allocation from the VW Mitigation Trust has been proposed for EMA 9: Light Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Supply Equipment. See: https://www.dec.ny.gov/docs/air_pdf/vwcleantransportplan19.pdf (pp. 1 & 23.)

Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2): DCFC EVSE funding will support the usage and adoption of light duty zero emission vehicles in the Jamestown, New York area, including in disadvantaged communities (DAC). Increased light duty zero emission vehicle usage will displace light duty conventional gasoline vehicle usage and associated exhaust emissions. Light duty zero emission vehicles will decrease nitrogen oxides (NOx) emissions and improve local air quality.

Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3): The projected NOx emission reductions over 10 years through this funding of EVSE is estimated to be 0.12 tons. The NOx reductions will be made possible by enabling an increase usage of light duty zero emission vehicles to displace an equal amount of light duty conventional gasoline and diesel vehicle miles traveled.

In addition, greenhouse gases, carbon monoxide (CO), particulate matter (PM), and volatile organic carbons (VOCs) will be reduced from this EVSE project. Final NOx emissions reductions will be calculated based on projects completed under this mitigation action.

New York State submitted an Appendix D-3, Certification for Beneficiary Status Under Environmental Trust Agreement, on November 1, 2017, in which the State of New York (NYS) agreed to maintain and make publicly available all documentation and records:

VW funding, provided through NYPA's DCFC EVSE program with Jamestown BPU, will fund an eligible portion of DCFC light duty EVSE equipment and installation costs, consistent with Appendix D-2 Mitigation Action Item #9 "up to" funding percentages. DCFC EVSE documented costs will be reviewed to ensure compliance with Appendix D-2. Jamestown BPU will locate all DCFC sites within a DEC identified disadvantaged community.

Describe how the Beneficiary complied with subparagraph 4.2.8, related to notice to U.S. Government Agencies (5.2.9).

NYSDEC (lead agency) notified the U.S. Government agencies as prescribed in 5.2.9 via email on February 9, 2018. See attached Notice of Availability of Mitigation Action Funds.

If applicable, describe how the mitigation action will mitigate the impacts of NOx emissions on communities that have historically borne a disproportionate share of the adverse impacts of such emissions (5.2.10). New York State's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan, Clean Transportation NY, describes the overall goals of improving air quality and accelerating the transition to zero emission transportation through funding made available under the Volkswagen Trust. These air quality improvement goals include reducing nitrogen oxides (NOx), greenhouse gases, particulate matter, hydrocarbon, and mobile source air toxics emissions throughout the state. Funding those projects described in the Plan will result in significant NOx reductions while accelerating the transformation to a zero-tailpipe emission transportation system. The project will be located in Jamestown, New York and will be located in disadvantaged communities subject to a disproportionate amount of air pollution from diesel-powered vehicles and equipment. NYPA and Jamestown BPU will conduct public outreach to notify residents and electric vehicle owners of the funded DCFC EVSE located within the identified DEC disadvantaged community area.

This light duty EVSE charging infrastructure project will lower NOx emissions and improve local air quality by supporting the adoption and expansion of light duty electric vehicles that operate throughout New York and often operate in communities that that have historically borne adisproportioned share of the adverse impact of diesel exhaust emissions.
