As per 2.1.1.5 of the Modified Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for Indian Tribe Beneficiaries (the "Indian Tribe Trust Agreement") filed with the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California on October 23, 2023 (Case 3:16-cv-00295-CRB), Northern Arizona University's Institute for Tribal Environmental Professionals (ITEP) submits the following semi-annual report. This report provides an overview of the progress of technical assistance activities provided by ITEP for the period of July 1 – December 31, 2023 (the "reporting period") in support of the Volkswagen Diesel Emissions Environmental Mitigation Trust for Indian Tribe Beneficiaries (the "Indian Tribe Trust").

Summary

ITEP's Scope of Work to provide technical assistance to all federally-recognized tribes seeking to access the Indian Tribe Trust began on October 1, 2017.

Specific project tasks for ITEP consist of the following:

- 1. One-on-One Technical Assistance
- 2. Web-based Outreach and Education
- 3. Webinars
- 4. In-Person Training & Outreach Events
- 5. Establishment of Tribal Advisory Council

Task 1: One-on-One Technical Assistance

ITEP staff provided email and phone-based technical assistance to tribes contacting ITEP directly. During the reporting period, ITEP provided technical assistance efforts to Tribes designated as Beneficiaries for the first through fourth funding cycles under the Indian Tribe Trust Agreement.

Upon being notified of the filing of the Modified Trust Agreement on October 23, 2023, ITEP began reaching out to all 119 Beneficiaries of the Indian Tribe Trust to inform them of the final distribution of funds and how they could participate if they wished to do so. Technical assistance from then until the funds were disbursed near the end of December primarily involved answering questions about the program, assisting Beneficiaries who wanted to participate with the preparation of the required forms for the final distribution, and uploading completed forms to Intralinks if needed. Throughout the reporting period ITEP also provided occasional help with reviewing semi-annual reports at Beneficiaries' request before they submitted them to the Trustee.

While ITEP made every effort to reach all 119 Beneficiaries to inform them of the final distribution, in all ITEP ended up working with 112 Tribes seeking technical assistance during the reporting period. A complete listing of Tribes provided technical assistance by ITEP is provided in Table 1.0 below.

Task 2: Web-based Outreach and Education

ITEP's VW Settlement Technical Assistance Program webpage (https://nau.edu/itep-vw) was maintained during the reporting period, and an update was provided once the Modified Trust Agreement was filed to announce the final distribution of funds. The table below provides details of website traffic for the reporting period.

Task 3: Webinars

During this reporting period ITEP conducted outreach and training to Tribes through a webinar offered on November 14th to present information about the final distribution of funds and how to complete the forms necessary to participate. The webinar was advertised to all 119 Beneficiaries, and 22 Beneficiaries attended it live. The webinar was also recorded, and afterward a link to the recording was distributed to all Beneficiaries so people who missed it or wanted to review what they'd heard could view the recording.

Task 4: In-Person Trainings & Outreach Events

Since new beneficiaries are no longer being accepted and the final distribution of funds played out rapidly over a brief period of time, ITEP did not conduct any in-person training or outreach activities during this reporting period.

Task 5: Establishment of Tribal Advisory Council

As part of the Modified Trust Agreement, ITEP was tasked with establishing a Tribal Advisory Council (TAC). The purpose of the TAC is to advise the technical assistance provider (ITEP) on its outreach and training efforts to ensure that Indian Tribes are aware of the Indian Tribe Trust, and to provide a forum for Indian Tribes to raise general questions relating to the Indian Tribe Trust Agreement.

In March, 2019, ITEP solicited applications for membership in the TAC, and in April the TAC was formally established with seven members from Tribes across the country, including Alaska. Current members* of the TAC are listed below.

- Amy Mignella: Hopi Tribe (Arizona)
- Dave Messier: Tanana Chiefs Conference (Alaska)
- David Wagner: Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Nation (Connecticut)
- Joe Cebe: Forest County Potawatomi Tribe (Wisconsin)
- Shain Heiss: contractor to Lower Brule Sioux Tribe (South Dakota)

The TAC met monthly from May, 2019, through March, 2022, to address questions from Tribes as they came up and provide feedback to ITEP and the Trustee about the process. The TAC did not meet during the reporting period.

* Two original members, Stephen Kullmann of Blue Lake Rancheria and Carter Thomas of Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians, left their Tribes' employment in 2020 and 2021, respectively, and are no longer serving on the TAC.

ITEP will continue to provide technical assistance to Beneficiaries of the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for Indian Tribe Beneficiaries as needed, reviewing reports to the Trustee (if requested by the Beneficiaries) through the termination of the program in June 2025.
