### Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2):

This project involves the installation of commercial DCFC infrastructure stations at 3 locations within the three priority areas identified in Illinois' BMP. These locations include retail shopping centers situated on major local streets and state highways in urbanized areas.

The grant award was established at 80% of eligible project costs for the DCFC charging stations, including any necessary utility connections and upgrades and network connectivity, signage, and collision barriers. The grant awards are capped at \$480,000 for three or more proposed sites and \$320,000 for two proposed sites in an application. Kerry Farms had one application selected to receive \$480,000 for 3 charging station locations. The DCFC stations will help reduce vehicle emissions and improve air quality by providing increased EV charging options that will promote the purchase and usage of more EVs and provide greater assurances to the public that charging will be available in these areas.

#### Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3):

Per the AFLEET Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Emissions Tool, the 3 DCFC charging stations will result in an estimated 54 pounds of annual NOx reductions.

Identification of Governmental Entity Responsible for Reviewing and Auditing Expenditures of Eligible Mitigation Action Funds to Ensure Compliance with Applicable Law (5.2.7.1): Illinois EPA

Describe how the Beneficiary will make documentation publicly available (5.2.7.2) The public may access documentation and records relative to the State of Illinois' administration of Trust Funds by submitting a request to the Illinois EPA pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1, et. seq.). The Illinois EPA has regulations ("Access to Public Records of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency," 2 Ill. Adm. Describe any cost share requirement to be placed on each NOx source proposed to be mitigated (5.2.8):

Environmental Mitigation Trust Funds will provide 80% funding of eligible costs for the DCFC charging stations. The applicants are required to provide a 20% cost share, resulting in a minimum cost share amount of \$120,000.

Describe how the Beneficiary complied with subparagraph 4.2.8, related to notice to U.S. Government Agencies (5.2.9):

Illinois EPA provided the requisite notice via email to the appropriate agencies on February 27, 2018.

If applicable, describe how the mitigation action will mitigate the impacts of NOx emissions on communities that have historically borne a disproportionate share of the adverse impacts of such emissions (5.2.10):

The shopping centers are situated on major local streets and state highways in urbanized areas. These areas experience a high volume of diesel truck traffic resulting in a disproportionate amount of diesel emissions. The DCFC sites will help mitigate NOx and other mobile source emissions in these areas.
