On January 29, 2018, Wilmington Trust (the “Trustee”) filed a Notice of Beneficiary Designation with the United States District Court for the Northern District of California (the “Court”), designating Rhode Island as a Beneficiary of the State Trust. Rhode Island’s [funding requests](#) were approved by the Trustee prior to this submission.

On December 6, 2018, Rhode Island’s first disbursement of Trust Assets occurred, beginning Rhode Island’s Reporting Obligations to the Trustee. As required by paragraph 5.3 the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement for State Beneficiaries (VW State Trust) we provide this report on the status of each Eligible Mitigation Action approved for funding through Rhode Island’s allotment of VW State Trust funds. Specifically, Rhode Island’s Reporting Obligations include:

1. A description on progress implementing each Eligible Mitigation Action during the period leading up to the reporting date;
2. A complete description of the status (including actual or projected termination date), development, implementation, and any modifications of each approved Eligible Mitigation Action.



Project Narrative

Electricity RI

Electricity RI is an electric vehicle (EV) charging station incentive program, administered by the Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources (OER), that seeks to make more charging stations accessible to Rhode Island drivers. The increased availability of charging stations will encourage state residents and business to make the switch to electric vehicles in order to reduce transportation-related carbon emissions and pollutants. This \$1.4 million incentive program is funding the installation of new EV charging stations – including Level II and Direct Current Fast Charging (DCFC) – at Rhode Island workplaces, multi-unit dwellings, and publicly-accessible locations. Incentives are offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

Three vehicle pilot electric bus program and purchase of up to 20 electric buses	<p>Revenue electric bus operations on the R-Line, running between downtown Pawtucket and Broad/City Line via downtown Providence began on January 22, 2024. Service started with 4 vehicles on the road and were progressively put into service as they met operational readiness requirements and acceptable thresholds for performance. The full electric fleet was deployed in June 2024, making public transportation in Rhode Island even greener. RIPTA will continue to monitor vehicles through all seasons to determine if any scheduling or other operational changes need to be made. Maintenance will be reviewing vehicle performance and engaging with New Flyer on a regular basis to address software or vehicle-related issues. RIPTA staff meet regularly to discuss service performance with the change in vehicles.</p> <p>The charging station powers RIPTA's first electric fleet – fourteen (14) New Flyer Xcelsior XE40 battery electric buses, all of which exclusively serve the R-Line. Electrifying this route will lower emissions on a key corridor, where many low-income and diverse communities have been affected by air pollution and experience high asthma rates.</p>
